

## Victoria Beckham's next fashion show is for families affected by cancer

### When fashion meets philanthropy

British fashion designer, Victoria Beckham, is preparing for a special fashion show, one which will benefit families affected by cancer. The former Spice Girl is set to take her sleek and 'posh' style to Toronto, Canada this November as the special guest in the fifth series of philanthropist Suzanne Rogers Presents events.

By partaking in this charity show, the mother-of-four will be following in the footsteps of notable designers like: Diane von Furstenberg, Oscar de la Renta, Marchesa and Zac Posen. They all partook in the fund-raising series which Suzanne started back in 2010. Money raised from the ticket sales for the presentation and lunch will go to several charities.

Two of which are: Camp Ooch, an oncology centre for families affected by childhood cancer, and The Penelope Neuroblastoma Foundation, which funds brain tumour research and provides support for families affected by the illness. Other charities will be announced closer to the event.

Victoria commented on the upcoming event, saying: "Suzanne's charitable endeavours in bettering the lives of children around the world is inspiring, and I am delighted to be involved in the next in her series of fundraisers." Since its formation, the events have managed to drum up more than \$3 million for charities supporting the wellbeing of young people. Suzanne expressed her excitement to be working with the designer, saying: "am so pleased that Victoria has accepted the invitation to come to Toronto and deeply appreciate her personal commitment and generosity in supporting our children's charities."

The 45-year-old branched out into child-wear back in 2017 in collaboration with Target. Her charity show will include more child-focused causes, which will also be confirmed closer to the event, and will be chaired by philanthropist Sylvia Mantella. Victoria has always worked towards giving back, as she is a UNAIDS international goodwill ambassador since 2014.
